*Do not preface the authors' names with the preposition 'By' or include 'And' before the final author. The presenting author should be underlined and authors' affiliation should be indicated by superscripted numerals as shown.*

*Leave one line space between Authors and Text.*

A variety of treatment approaches have been proposed in the mangement of head injury (Baxter, 1991), however there is little evidence to support any one approach over another (Other, 1994) .....

*Indent all paragraphs with no line spacing between paragraphs. A maximum of two references may be included and these should be in the Vancouver style, ie numbered within the text and listed at the end of the abstract as detailed below.*
